If you have a child entering **1st Grade** in public school in Fall 2015, be sure to register that child for P.R.E.P. (Parish Religious Education Program).

Please understand that the Diocese of Allentown requires a child to have 2 years of religious education in order to receive the Sacraments of First Penance and First Eucharist in 2nd Grade.
